Subject Comment

This term, Year 8 students have been preparing for their end-of-year exams, focusing on consolidating the skills they've learned throughout the year. The exam is skills-based, consisting of two papers: one on fiction and the other on non-fiction. Each paper is divided into two sections, A and B. Section A is focused on reading. It includes a variety of short-answer questions that test students' abilities to identify both implicit and explicit information, analyse language features, and understand punctuation use. There are also longer questions for deeper analysis of texts. Section B tests writing skills. Students are required to write in specific styles, with marks awarded for content, style, structure, spelling, and sentence structure. This includes the use of grammatical structures, correct punctuation, and a variety of sentence styles. Students have been practising these skills intensively, ensuring they are well-prepared for the upcoming exams.

Feedback and targets

- Chan demonstrates excellent skills in identifying the main ideas and themes within a text.
- He effectively analyses the impact of specific word choices on the meaning of the text.
- Chan shows proficiency in understanding the structure and organisation of the text.

Targets:

- I would encourage Chan to work on enhancing his ability to analyse character development and motivations; he can do this by tracking character growth throughout his reading book.
- I recommend that Chan develop his skills in evaluating text structures by comparing the structures of various texts he reads.

During this year students will begin to embark on their IGCSE journey with much of the foundational knowledge being covered in Years 7 and 8. Students will begin to deepen their understanding of the core components; Number, Algebra, Statistics and Geometry. As well as learn about new concepts such as transformations of shapes and real life graphs. We gauge student progress at three key assessment points throughout the year in early December, late February and their end of year assessment.

Feedback and targets

Chan shows good mathematical insight, demonstrating a strong understanding of key concepts. He engages actively in class discussions and frequently offers valuable insights and asks thoughtful questions. Chan shows a positive attitude towards challenges and is not afraid to attempt the more challenging questions to develop his understanding.

Targets:

Chan should use the upcoming Re-Teach Week to revise the more challenging content to be best ready for the new year. He should aim to more independently tackle problem-solving questions that require multiple mathematical concepts and processes.

They discern character traits, narrative elements, and thematic connections to classroom learning, synthesising peer perspectives for real-world application. Beyond academics, extracurricular readings include folklore, enhancing cultural understanding, familial relationships, and varied lifestyles from multiple viewpoints.

This term, students acquired vital skills in Thai language studies, encompassing language accuracy, grasping significance, descriptive writing, and analysis, essential for IGCSE Thai exam preparation. Proficiencies span fast reading, summarization, pinpoint responses, and continuous communication, intriguingly applied through varied skills integration from all lessons and principles learned. Noteworthy are adept word selection, clear content articulation, relevance to queries, and effective communication.

Feedback and targets

Chan maintains a positive attitude and shows self-motivation in learning. He understands main ideas, draws clear conclusions, and provides mostly accurate responses with specific examples. His writing features varied vocabulary and sentence structures, showing strong comprehension in both listening and reading. He organizes ideas well and connects them logically. I recommend Chan practice spelling for at least 20 minutes each week.

Y8 began the year with SKILLS, a series of exercises to build up drawing, painting, photography and collage skills. This is a time of experimentation designed to encourage risk taking and learning through mistakes. From basic shapes and drawing skills, students then moved onto study colour: primary, secondary and tertiary colours. We added to the Scheme of Work a collaborative project with the Science Department. Having developed a range of skills we then encouraged each student to choose a favourite work of Art. This then acted as starting point to build individualism into the Scheme of Work. We then taught Art Key Words and how to how to analyse a work of Art using a framework to include: Content, Process, Mood, Form. To bring the year to a close students will then develop a Final Outcome, a personal response inspired by the artists studied. This process of studying artists, experimenting, development and the production of a Final Outcome gives our students in Y8 a taste of what it is like to do iGCSE Art.

Feedback and targets

Chan is motivated, quick to experiment and is always ready try out new approaches to Art making. Chan's drawing, painting and digital skills have all improved.

Targets:

To take Chan's Art to the next level Chan needs to annotate his work which will help him to explain his ideas. Because time is limited to one hour a week, I would also recommend that Chan comes to Art Club. Art Club runs Monday - Thursday. Alternatively Chan could take his sketchbook home after each lesson.

Drama at DBS is divided into 3 strands of learning: Creating, Performing and Reflecting.

In Term 1, Year 8 developed their design and performance focussing on the play 'War Horse'. Students were immersed in the context of WW1- the setting of the play and learnt how to design and create puppets as well as costume, sound and set. The performance part of the unit saw students become soldiers in the play, performing a unique scene in no man's land. The next unit focused on physical theatre looking at different styles and learning about the performance potential of ensemble work that is controlled, precise and creative. Looking at a range of contexts and theatre groups the students produced a range of physical theatre pieces using a variety of skills to create meaning. Most recently, Year 8 have focused their energies on devising work from a stimulus using their creativity and performance skills to create their own drama.

Chan is able to create a clearly defined character with depth and motivation.
