Such students meet the *vast majority* of homework and assignment deadlines, are *nearly always* punctual to class, *nearly always* bring the necessary equipment and are *nearly always* attentive in class i.e. they are *nearly always* willing to participate in class discussions, and *nearly always* willingly work individually or as part of a group as required by the teacher.

#### **Sometimes**

This grade is awarded to students who *sometimes* try hard in some aspects of their work. Such students *generally* try to meet homework and assignment deadlines, but might *occasionally* produce work late or come to class illequipped or be inattentive at times. They are *sometimes* willing to participate in class discussions, or to work individually or as part of a group as required by the teacher.

#### **Seldom**

This grade is awarded to students who *consistently* fail to make any effort in most aspects of their work. Such students *frequently* produce work late or come to class ill-equipped or are inattentive. They are *reluctant* to participate in class discussions, and are *reluctant* or even *refuse* to work individually or as part of a group as required by the teacher.

Jack is confident and mature in his approach to study. He has a calm, steady head. He makes the most of every lesson and tries his best. He is one of the top performers on DrFrostMaths amassing over 12500 points which represents 3700 questions answered correctly.

Jack has taken 6 end-of-unit assessments over the year. The results are: Number 82% (Grade B), Algebra 100% (Grade A), Shape and Space 83% (Grade A), Number 95% (Grade A), Algebra 75% (Grade A), Shape and Space 100% (Grade A). In his end-of-year exam Jack scored 89% which was awarded a Grade A.

The most important aspect of his maths that he should still be working on at this stage is his algebraic manipulation. His algebra is already good, but with extra practice and determination it could be very good. Jack needs this level of algebra to maintain his current trajectory, which is to complete the IGCSE course by the end of Year 10 and progress to study Additional Maths IGCSE in Year 11. The Additional Maths IGCSE is a much harder mathematics course which offers a much more thorough preparation for A Level Maths or IB Diploma Maths.

Overall I am delighted with Jack's progress this year. He is a competent and able mathematician who is capable of the highest level of achievement. I look forward to teaching him next year and seeing him explore maths at a deeper level. Well Done Jack.
